Please disregard if you do not have further reimbursements you wish to submit for the 2023-24 school year.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

The deadline to submit 2023-24 reimbursement requests for the Family Empowerment Scholarship for Students with Unique Abilities (FES-UA) program is July 31, 2024.

This means you must submit requests for reimbursements of items or services purchased between July 1, 2023 and June 30, 2024 with all necessary documents by July 31, 2024. As long as your student's account is "active," unused funds from a prior year will roll forward into the following school year's balance. Please see the note below for "inactive" accounts to learn more on how to keep your student's account active.

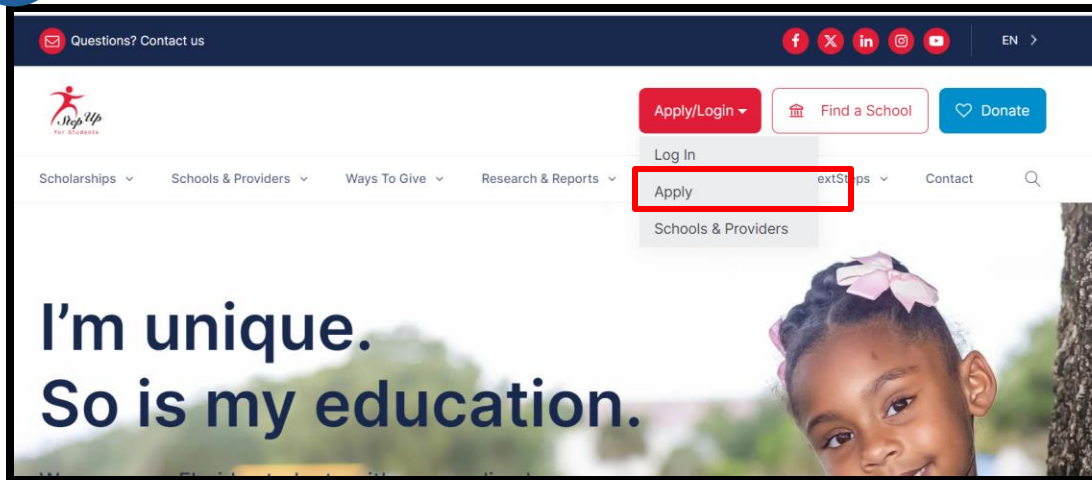

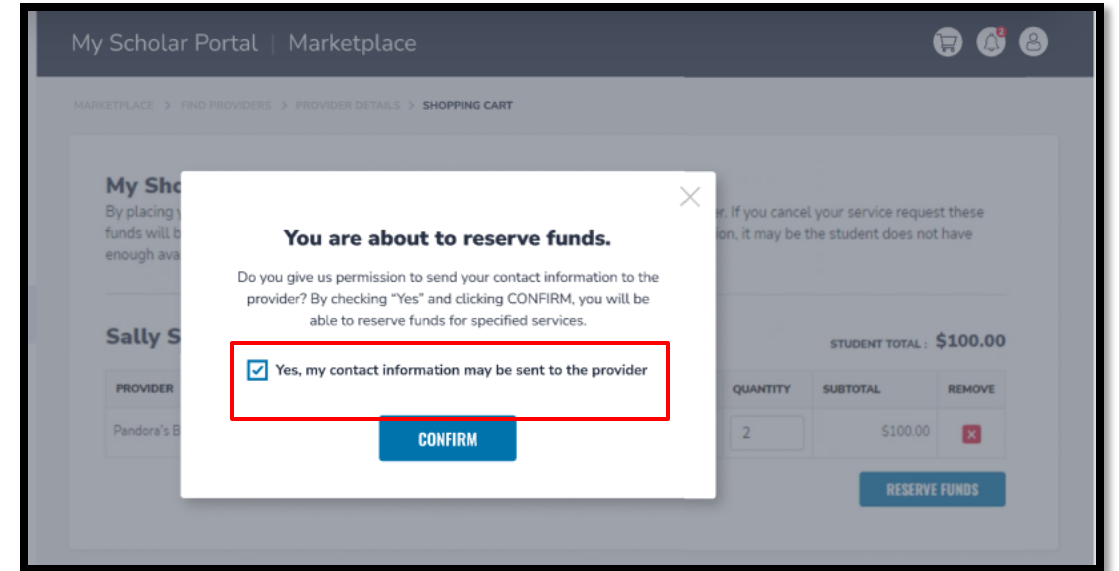
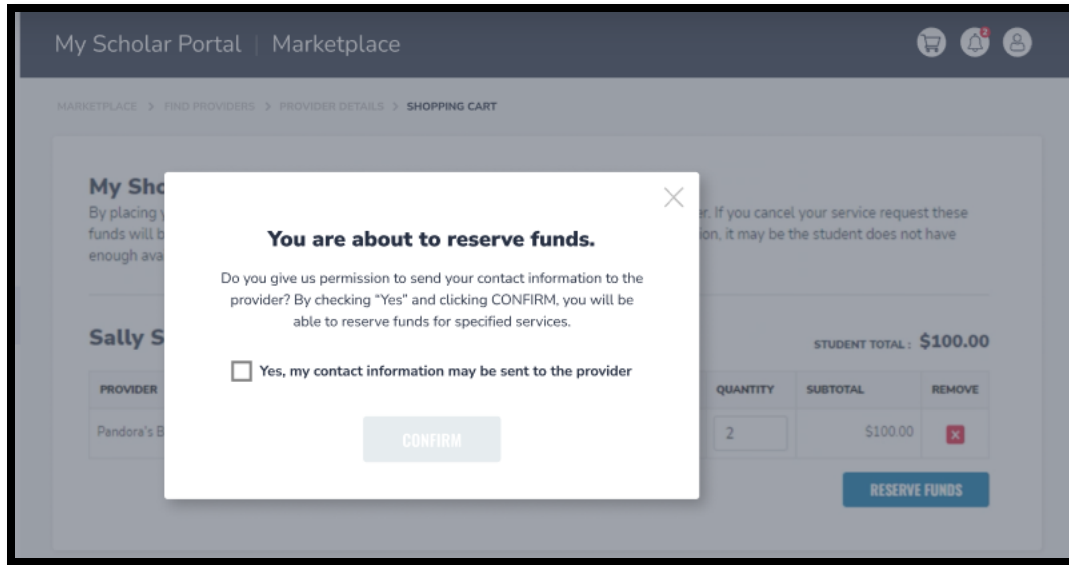

After adding the 529/Pre-Paid plan to your cart, select "Reserve Funds" to proceed to checkout. You will need to confirm permission to send your contact information to the provider by checking the box for "Yes" before the "Confirm" button appears.

Important Notice

Direct contribution requests must be submitted by the 14th day of each month and will be sent to Florida Prepaid for verification monthly before each payment is made. The student's name listed on the scholarship account must match the name of the beneficiary of the Florida 529 College Savings account. Any requests received after the 14th day of each month will not be sent to Florida Prepaid for verification until the next month.






Can we use the FES-UA funds for homeschooled kids in 2024-25? If yes, how?

FES-UA Funds to Support Homeschool Education Program

Answer

Yes, you may use FES-UA funds to support a Home Education Program in the 2024-2025 school year. Please remember that if you are conducting a Home Education Program that you may be required to notify your local school district of your intent to homeschool.





If I have left over money and have put it in a 529 through SUFS, what happens the following year if I return to public school?

Leftover Funds in 529 Plan

Answer

Money correctly contributed to a 529 account through SUFS will stay there for use in college even if you return to public school the next school year.



Will renewal families from the 22-23 school year still use the Legacy system next year?

Legacy System & Reimbursements

Answer

Renewal families from the 2022-23 school year will still use the Legacy system for reimbursements and direct pay activity for the start of the 2024-25 school year. 2022-23 renewal families will be moved to EMA later in the 2024-25 school year.



I gave my child's award ID to an eligible private school for the 2024-25 school year, but I am considering homeschooling. What is the process to withdraw from the school?

Declining School Enrollment

Answer

Notify the school right away if you do not plan to attend. The school will withdraw your child from EMA. If the school needs assistance with this, they can contact SUFS for help.



What ways can FES-UA funds be used if not enrolled in a private school?

Ways to Use FES-UA Funds

Answer

To see all the ways, you may use FES-UA funds (whether in a private school or not), review the Purchasing Guide as it has a very expansive list of services and items you may purchase. This Guide can be found on our website.

What is the difference between funded and awarded?

Funded vs Awarded

Answer

Awarded means that your student has been found eligible for an FES-UA scholarship and will be presented to the Department of Education for funding. Funded means that the DOE has granted funding for your student and the funding has been applied to their Educational Savings Account.



Can I use FES-UA funds to pay for the VPK hours after VPK hours end?

FES-UA Funds & VPK Hours



Answer

FES-UA funds can be used to cover tuition and fees for part-time or full-time enrollment at an eligible preschool. This could be just the VPK hours or the “wrap” hours.

- Visit the library and participate in its fun activities, such as read-aloud or book reading challenges.

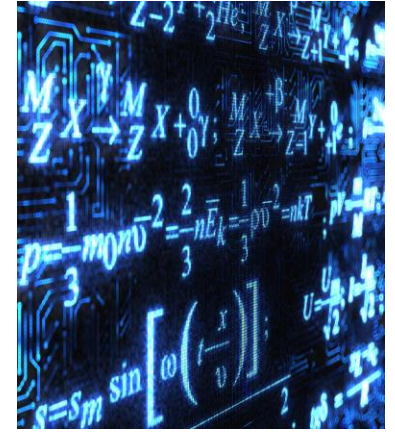
