




Tuition and Fees

FTC/FES-EO scholarship funds must first be committed to a participating private school. Any remaining funds can be used on the following expenses.


- Eligible private school
- Eligible postsecondary institution
- Approved pre-apprenticeship program
- Fees for part-time tutoring or Choice Navigator services
- Approved online or virtual provider
- Private-pay student for Florida Virtual School
- Contracted services provided by a public school or school district

- Instructional materials
- Curriculum
- Standardized testing fees



Deadline for Submitting Reimbursements for the 2023-2024 School Year



- Goods or services must be purchased between July 1, 2023, and June 30, 2024.
- All reimbursement requests must be received by Step Up For Students by July 31, 2024.

Reimbursement Best Practices for Families

Account Balances

A student's unspent ESA funds may be rolled over from one school year into the next school year. However, once the student's scholarship account balance reaches \$24,000, Step Up For Students may not transfer scholarship funds into the student's scholarship account.

Parents/guardians are encouraged to monitor their student's scholarship balance and spending to ensure they remain eligible for scholarship payments.

Closure of Accounts

A student's scholarship account must be closed, and any remaining funds will be returned to the state after:

- Denial or revocation of program eligibility by the commissioner for fraud or abuse, including, but not limited to, the student or student's parent accepting any payment, refund, or rebate, in any manner, from a provider of any services received
- Any period of two consecutive fiscal years in which an account has been inactive.

Changing Scholarships

ANSWER: Please contact the Customer Engagement Center at (877)735-7837 to get help declining the current scholarship you have applied for. After that, you can apply for either the Personalized Education Plan (PEP) or the Family Empowerment Scholarship for Unique Abilities (FES-UA). Is MyScholarShop only available for homeschool?

Answer: No, MyScholarShop is available for all scholarship students; however, the items you can purchase depend on the scholarship you have been awarded. For a list of approved purchases for the FTC/FES-EO scholarships, see the Purchasing Guide linked here.

Is MyScholarShop free?

Answer: The cost of items in MyScholarShop varies, but you can use your scholarship dollars to make purchases.

Is MyScholarShop only available to families with remaining funds?

Answer: MyScholarShop is available to all families with remaining funds.





If I have remaining scholarship funds in my account, how will those funds apply towards the next school year?

Rollover Funding & Use

Answer:

Unspent scholarship funds from one school year will remain in a student's account for the following school year. Reimbursements for program expenditures may continue until the account balance is expended or no activity in the account for 2 years will result in returned funds to the state.

The student's scholarship account must be closed, and any remaining funds shall revert to the state after:

- 1. Denial or revocation of program eligibility by the commissioner for fraud or abuse, including, but not limited to, the student or student's parent accepting any payment, refund, or rebate, in any manner, from a provider of any services received pursuant to paragraph (4)(a); or
- 2.Two consecutive fiscal years in which an account has been inactive; or
- 3. A student remains unenrolled in an eligible private school for 30 days while receiving a scholarship that requires full-time enrollment.



Can the Transportation Stipend be used with New Worlds Scholarship Accounts (formerly New Worlds Reading)?

Transportation Stipend & The New Worlds Scholarship Account



Answer:

Yes, if your student is eligible, you may apply for both the Transportation Stipend, New Worlds Scholarship Account.





Why do parents need to approve quarterly payments next year?

Approving Quarterly Payments

ANSWER:

As part of scholarship participation, parent and student responsibilities listed in Florida statute include the requirement that parents approve each payment before scholarship funds can be deposited. The parent may not designate any entity or individual associated with the eligible private school to approve payments.



Avoiding the Summer Slide

Did you know kids can lose some academic skills and knowledge over the summer if they don't use them?



Summer Regression, or the Summer Slide, is the loss of academic skills over the summer.

Studies show that reading six books over the summer can help prevent the Summer Slide.

Find ways to keep your child's mind active during the summer months.

Summer Slide Prevention Tips

Ways to prevent Summer Slide

- Read every day, or be read to, and choose books that interest you.
- Practice math skills by playing games, doing crafts, or using math functions in daily activities.
- Find something interesting to investigate, such as a new recipe, a science experiment, or a learning adventure.
- Visit the library and participate in its fun activities, such as read-aloud or book reading challenges.



Summer Slide Prevention Resources




