Subject: A message from Step Up's CEO

Date: 9/6/2024

Dear Step Up Families,

I hope your new school year is off to a great start.

Students.

I have spent my career tackling complex banking and payment challenges. In this role, I've been focused on listening, learning, and delivering improvements for families and educators.

I wanted to share an update on what I've learned so far, our progress addressing your feedback, and two of our key priorities: delivering timely payments to schools and improving our processing of reimbursement requests.

School payments This year, we are currently serving more than 436,800 scholarship students. Of those, more than 340,000 are enrolled in eligible private schools.

Our team has been delivering faster payments to schools. As of today, a total of 281,000 tuition invoices have been approved by both the school and the parent or guardian. Of those, Step Up has paid 278,000, or nearly 99%, in 6.5 calendar days on average. Our team continues to process invoices as they are approved.

As of 11:45 a.m. ET on September 2, 2024, our records indicated that your student's 2024-25 SLP had not yet been submitted. Note: The 2024-25 SLP was released on June 20, 2024, and contains new content. Any SLP submitted before this date will not be accepted for the 2024-25 school year.

Students funded on the PEP scholarship in the spring of the 2023-24 school year must submit the student's 2023-24 end-of-year norm-referenced annual assessment results by October 15, 2024.

As of 11:45 a.m. ET on September 2, 2024, our records indicated that your student's 2023-24 end-of-year norm-referenced annual assessment results had not yet been submitted.

If you do not submit your student's end-of-year norm-referenced annual assessment results by 11:59 p.m. ET on October 15, 2024, no additional funding will be distributed to your student's account. Should your student choose to return to the program in a future year, your student will be considered a new student.



Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program Personalized Education Program



Funds have recently been added to your student's Personalized Education Program (PEP) scholarship account for the 2024-25 school year.

Your 2024-25 scholarship funds can be used towards personalizing your child's education for items purchased and services rendered between July 1, 2024, and June

Please note: For students with rollover funds from the 2023-24 school year, the student's available balance may momentarily fluctuate as guarterly funds are applied to the student's account. The student's account should reflect correctly within 15-30



PEP Hybrid School Option



PEP students are permitted to participate in hybrid learning!

A PEP Hybrid School is a private school, approved by the Florida Department of Education (FLDOE), that provides <u>PEP students with the option for regular in-</u> person attendance at the FLDOE-approved school location at least two days per week. These schools are registered private schools with the FLDOE and have been approved by the FLDOE to offer hybrid learning to PEP students.

PEP Hybrid School Option

• There is a difference between tuition for the PEP Hybrid School and part-time

• The PEP <u>Hybrid school</u> is simply a legal distinction allowing PEP students to meet the state's school attendance requirements without having to be a full-time

<u>Part-time instruction</u> does not have yearly, weekly, monthly, or daily attendance requirements. Part-time students who are not participating in PEP Hybrid can







NEW 2024-25 FTC/FES-E0/PEP PURCHASING GUIDELINES



Q: How do we switch from homeschool to FTCPEP - Florida Tax Credit Scholarship, Personalized Education Program?

A: To switch from homeschool to Florida Tax Credit Scholarship, Personalized Education Program (FTCPEP), these steps:

Apply for FTCPEP: Submit an application for the scholarship through Step Up For Students.

- 1. Withdraw from Homeschool: Notify your local school district to officially withdraw your child from homeschool.
- 2. Submit Documentation: Provide all required documentation to Step Up For Students to finalize the scholarship.
 - Student Learning Plan (SLP) is due by January 15, or the student will not receive scholarship funding for the 2024-2025 school year.

Q: It is my first year with the scholarship, do I need to have my children take tests and submit scores before I can use funds or do I submit those at the end of the year?

A: Students funded on the PEP scholarship in the spring of the 2023-24 school year must submit the student's 2023-24 end-of-year norm-referenced annual assessment results by October 15, 2024. If your student is new to the PEP Scholarship this year, they will be required to submit their end-of-year norm-referenced annual assessment results for the 2024-25 school year before program renewal for the 2025-2026 school year. Q: I am taking my kids to Washington DC and Williamsburg in October for an educational field trip. Do I need to get a pre-authorization for the museum admission tickets or do I purchase them and then get reimbursed? It's out of state so I am confused.

A: Yes, non-school affiliated Field Trip activities occurring outside of the state of Florida, but within the United States require a pre-authorization. Additionally, out-of-state field trips and Florida theme park admission reimbursement requests must be accompanied by the <u>Educational Benefit Form</u>. (FESEO/FTC/PEP Purchasing Guide Pg 8-9)



Q: As a new member to the PEP Scholarship, it would be nice to have a link to the "Shop" where I can purchase supplies and materials directly using the funding. Can you share any information confirming the tax implications of this (ie. is this scholarship) tax exempt?)

A: MyScholarShop is NOT a special link; it can be found within your Marketplace, inside your EMA Account. You will have access to the MyScholarShop within the Marketplace when funds have been deposited into your account. Purchases made with scholarship dollars are not tax-exempt but scholarships do not count as taxable income.

How to Access and Use MyScholarShop

- **1. Log In: Visit the Step Up website and log in to your account.**
- 2. Access MyScholarShop: Click on the "Marketplace" tab within EMA.
- **3. Select a Student: Choose the student you want to purchase items for.**
- 4. Browse and Select Items: Explore the available items and add your selections to the cart.
- 5. Place Order: Review your cart, proceed to checkout, and place your order.





Q: Can unused scholarship funds at year-end be carried over to the following year? If so, how can I use the funds?

A: Once funds are deposited into a student's account, parents or guardians can use them for approved items and services listed in the Purchasing Guide. Unused funds can roll over to the next school year. However, per Florida law, Step Up For Students cannot transfer funds if the account balance exceeds \$24,000. If a student enrolls in a public school, graduates, or turns 21 by July 1 (whichever comes first), they will no longer be eligible for additional funding, but existing funds will remain in their EMA account.

Q: If more money is spent in a quarter than is funded, do we just wait for the following quarter to submit it for reimbursement? Do the quarterly funds need to be used/submitted during that period, or do the funds carry over between quarters and years? Where do I find the dates for when reimbursements need to be submitted?

A: If more money is spent in a given quarter than what is funded, then you can wait until the next funding of the account to submit for that reimbursement. Quarterly funds can be carried over between quarters and years. Reimbursement requests are year-specific. Requests for reimbursements using scholarship funds from the 2024-25 school year may be submitted at any time after the purchase is made, as long as the items or services were purchased between July 1, 2024, and June 30, 2025. Please allow up to 60 days for a reimbursement request with the required supporting documentation to be fully reviewed.

Q: Can students who go to public school get funded?

A: A student awarded an FTC, FES-EO, or PEP scholarship may not enroll full-time in any public school, including:

- A charter school
- A developmental research school
- Any other Florida public school
- Florida Virtual School or any other online public school
- The College-Preparatory Boarding Academy
- The Florida Scholars Academy
- The Florida School for Competitive Academics
- •or The Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind.

PEP scholarship students must be provided the same flexibility and opportunities outlined in sections (3) - (12) of Florida's Home Education statute, including access to classes and extracurricular activities offered by their local public schools. Parents and guardians may use their student's scholarship to pay for classes or services provided by public schools, but public schools may not report the student to the state for funding. A scholarship student who receives contracted services from a public school is not considered enrolled in a public school for scholarship eligibility, but rather attending a public school on a part-time basis






