

Step Up For Students empowers families to pursue and engage in the most appropriate learning options for their children.



### Who is Step Up For Students?

Step Up For Students is a state-approved, nonprofit, Scholarship Funding Organization (SFO) with a mission to help students find their place within Florida's public and private education system.



#### **Legislative Updates**

#### Personalized Education Program (PEP)

Allow PEP students to use scholarship funds to pay for tuition at hybrid private schools, approved by the DOE to participate in PEP. Students must attend at least two school days per week at the school's physical location. A student learning plan must explain remaining instructional hours occurring outside of the hybrid school.



#### **Hybrid School Option**



Please be aware that this provision does not extend to non-participating private schools or entities already authorized under s.1002.395(6)(d), which covers full-time tutoring, home education programs, and more.

The Department of Education (DOE) will furnish SUFS with a list of approved participating private schools.



# Overview of the Personalized Education Program (FTCPEP)

Florida students in grades K-12 who are <u>not enrolled full-time</u> in a private or public school may access the Personalized Education Program (PEP). This scholarship is an education savings account (ESA) that can be used to support the educational needs of eligible students.

The program can serve up to 60,000 students in the 2024-25 school year and may grow by 40,000 annually.



# Overview of the Personalized Education Program (FTCPEP) cont...

#### **PEP students must:**

- Declare a grade level for eligibility and scholarship values.
- Maintain an annual Student Learning Plan (SLP) in order to be funded.
- Withdraw as a full-time public or private school student or terminate a home education program with their school district before receiving PEP scholarship funding
- Take a norm-referenced test annually and submit results to Step Up For Students.



# Overview of the Personalized Education Program (FTCPEP) cont...

#### **How Does It Work?**

PEP scholarships provide access to an education savings account (ESA) that functions like a bank account. Families direct these funds to pay for:


- Instructional Material
- Curriculum
- A virtual program approved by the FLDOE
- Fees for services provided by a Choice Navigator
- Contracted services provided by a public school or school district, including classes

- Tuition for an eligible home education instruction program
- Fees for nationally standardized norm-referenced tests and other assessments
- Tuition and fees for private tutoring programs
- Tuition as a private pay student at Florida Virtual School

- Education at an eligible postsecondary educational institution or approved apprenticeship program
- Digital materials exclusive of digital devices such as a laptop

As of August 1, 2024, the Florida Tax Credit Scholarship (FTC), Family Empowerment Scholarship for Educational Options (FES-EO) and Personalized Education Program (PEP) Purchasing Guide is updated for the 2024-25 school year. Here's a breakdown of what is new or changed in the guide





#### Where To Find The Pre-Authorization Form

- 1. Visit www.sufs.org
- 2. Click on the red 'Apply/Login' button at the top of the page
- 3. Choose 'Apply' from the drop down menu
- 4. Under the Resources section, click on "Pre-Authorization Form"

\*\*Legacy families will need to continue using the Legacy system to submit their Pre-Authorizations.







2024-2025 Pre-Authorization Form



Dear Parent/Guardian,

A process is now available for families to submit 2024-25 pre-authorization requests. Pre-authorizations are needed when an item or service is not listed in the Purchasing Guide, or is indicated as requiring a pre-authorization request (this includes items on MyScholarShop requiring a pre-authorization.)

Please <u>click here</u> to watch a helpful video about how to submit a pre-authorization request. You may also read through the steps below.

#### **Pre-Authorization Steps:**

- Step 1: Parent/guardian submits a pre-authorization request using this form.
- Step 2: Step Up reviews if the pre-authorization is eligible for reimbursement or a MyScholarShop purchase.
- Step 3: Parent/guardian will receive an email explaining whether the preauthorization request is approved, placed on hold, or denied.
  - If a pre-authorization request is approved: Parent/guardian may submit a MyScholarShop order OR a reimbursement request for their pre-authorized item/service by adding the pre-authorization number in the reimbursement comments section. This will allow processors to verify the item was preauthorized.
  - If a pre-authorization request is placed on hold: Parent/guardian will submit the documents requested by Step Up to complete the process for the pre-authorization. This can be done by completing the on hold form.
  - If a pre-authorization request is denied: Parent/guardian's request is not eligible for pre-authorization. An appeal for a denied request may only be submitted once by completing this <u>form</u>. Select "yes" on the appeal dropdown, and include the pre-authorization request number in the appeal description box.

IMPORTANT: Students who have been using the Family Empowerment Scholarship for Students with Unique Abilities program since the 2022-23 school year and before, must submit pre-authorization and reimbursement requests through their legacy Parent Portal account. Reimbursements submitted in EMA for these students will be denied.

## How To Submit A Pre-Authorization

Many items and services have been preapproved as authorized uses of scholarship funds.

However, some require parents/guardians to submit a pre-authorization request in advance of making the purchase.



## List of Items Requiring a PreAuthorization

- •Overnight or day educational camps with documentation of educational benefit
- Multiple of a single At-Home Classroom Furnishings item that exceeds \$50
- Multiple of a single digital periphery device that exceeds \$50
- Multiples of a single elective item that exceeds \$50
- Assistive devices not enumerated in this guide
- Adaptive exercise equipment
- P.E. activities occurring outside of the state of Florida



## List of Items Requiring a PreAuthorization

- Curriculum that is not publicly available
- Full or half-day education programs for students aged 16 and up
- Televisions over 55 inches
- Fees associated with standardized testing or examinations not listed in the handbook
- Non-school affiliated field trip activities occurring outside of the State of Florida, but within the United States
- Items or services that fall outside the frequency of purchase requirements listed in the handbook (within Digital Devices, P.E., Electives, At-Home Classroom Furnishings)





## Best Practices for a Pre-Authorization

Please ensure that you thoroughly complete all required fields and provide a detailed description in the preauthorization form.

Please make sure to upload all appropriate documentation, including an image or screenshot of the requested item.

Additionally, include any doctor's notes, prescriptions, referral letters, etc., that support the request.



## Best Practices for a Pre-Authorization

If approved, the items or services submitted on the reimbursement must match those on the preauthorization. If they do not, Step Up For Students reserves the right to deny the reimbursement request.

An approved pre-authorization is valid for purchases in the school year in which it was approved.

If an item requires pre-authorization, the pre-authorization process must be completed and there must be an approval prior to placing the order.

Step Up For Students considers the manufacturer's recommended minimum age when processing preauthorization requests. Prior approval of items or services due to error does not constitute policy.

Approval of pre-authorization requests are made on a case-by-case basis relevant to the circumstances of the individual student.



# PreAuthorizations for Goods & Services

#### **Important Information:**

Please review the purchasing guide to ensure that your requested item or service is not listed as an approved or eligible expense. These items do not require pre-authorization.

When requesting pre-authorization for elective courses or items related to elective courses, please be sure to describe the curriculum being used, even if the curriculum/course is parent-designed.

The pre-authorization should be specific to the student and contain as much detail about the specific item or service being requested as possible, including the approximate cost. Also, be sure to include a link or screenshot that shows the item or service.

When requesting pre-authorization for a Specialized Summer Education Program, please include the program's start and end dates in the documentation.


#### **IMPORTANT:**

Students who have been using the Family Empowerment Scholarship for Students with Unique Abilities program since the 2022-23 school year and before, must submit pre-authorization and reimbursement requests through their legacy Parent Portal account. IMPORTANT: You must add the pre-authorization number (listed above) for this request in the reimbursement comments section.

This will allow processors to verify the item was pre-authorized.





## Once Your Pre-Authorization Is Approved:

- 1.Return to EMA
- 2.Click on the 'Reimbursement' tab on the left
- 3. Create a new reimbursement.
- 4. Upload all required documents.
- 5. Fill in all required boxes.
- 6.Reference the pre-authorization number in the educational benefit box.




## Pre-Authorization Status

If a pre-authorization request is placed "On Hold": Parent/guardian will need to re-submit your pre-authorization request. A new form will be emailed to the parent to complete. Please include the required information, documentation and or the link associated with your item or service.

If a pre-authorization request is "Denied": Parent/guardian's request is not eligible for pre-authorization. An appeal for a denied request may only be submitted once by completing this form. Select "yes" on the appeal drop-down menu and include the pre-authorization request number in the appeal description box. The appeal decision for Step Up For Students is final.









Handbook Highlight

The Personalized Education Program (PEP) parent handbook serves as a guide on how to utilize your scholarship funds.

Over the next few slides, we will show you where to find answers to some of your most frequently asked questions we get about the Personalized Education Program (PEP) scholarship.



## Transferring Among Scholarship Funding Organizations pgs. 16-17

Step Up For Students is one of Florida's approved Scholarship Funding Organizations (SFOs). A student may only have a scholarship funded through one SFO at a time. Scholarship applications and awards are not transferable between SFOs. A student awarded a scholarship by one SFO who has not yet received funding and wants to move to a different SFO must decline their scholarship with their current SFO and submit a new scholarship application with a different SFO. Step Up For Students' scholarship decline form is available here.

A parent or guardian of a student awarded scholarships by multiple SFOs must select the organization they would like to administer their scholarship and decline scholarships from the others. Step Up cannot receive incoming transfer requests. If a student has received funding from one SFO, and the parent or guardian would like to transfer administration of their student's scholarship to a different SFO, they must initiate a transfer as follows:

<u>Students transferring into Step Up:</u> A parent or guardian of a student with a scholarship funded by another SFO who wishes to transfer to Step Up For Students should contact their current SFO to initiate a transfer process.

<u>Students transferring out of Step Up:</u> A parent or guardian of a student with a scholarship currently funded by Step Up For Students should contact Step Up to request a transfer to another SFO. Step Up will work with the other SFO to begin the transfer process. Transferring funds may take several months to complete.

Q: What digital devices(computers/printers) are approved for reimbursement? and will there be an updated purchasing guide for 2025?

A: Currently, digital devices are not statutorily allowed for the PEP scholarship. The 2024-2025 Purchasing Guide can be accessed using the QR code or by click the link <u>here</u>.



#### Q: After graduation, if there are funds still in the account, what can they be used for?

A: After graduation, approved items that are found in the Purchasing Guide can still be purchased. Some of these purchases that can be made are tuition and Fees at an Eligible Postsecondary Institution Tuition and fees required for enrollment at an eligible postsecondary institution, or a program offered by an eligible postsecondary institution, are covered by FTC/FES-EO. Eligible postsecondary institutions include:

A Florida College System institution

A school district technical center

A state university

- A school district adult general education center
- An independent college or university that is eligible to participate in the William L Boyd, IV Effective Access to Student Education Grant Program under s. 1009.89, F.S.
- An accredited independent postsecondary educational institution, as defined in s. 1005.02, F.S., which is licensed to operate in the state of Florida (under part III of Effective August 2024) or

Tuition and fees for an organized course of instruction designed to prepare a person 16 years of age or older to become an apprentice in a course approved by and registered with the department and sponsored by a registered apprenticeship program under s. 446.042, F.S. Funds can continue to be used until the account is depleted. The account must remain active by making at least one purchase per year. If the account remains dormant for two or more years, then the funds are returned to the Department of Education.

Q: What types of providers (extra curricular activities, music, sports, foreign language, etc.) can you utilize with your scholarship dollars? What qualifications do they need?

A: Providers of extracurricular activities including but not limited to dance lessons, sports lessons (including individual training or group training), art lessons, cooking lessons, drama lessons, music lessons, sewing lessons, and foreign language lessons can be paid using scholarship funds.

Eligible providers for enrichment or elective subjects should have one of the following:

- Certification or national accreditation in the relevant subject area.
- Currently enrolled in a postsecondary educational institution as a student of the relevant subject area;
- Degree from a postsecondary educational institution in the relevant subject area;
- Eligible to provide part-time tutoring services as identified in the requirements listed in the Tuition and Fees for Part-Time Tutoring Services or Fees for Choice Navigator Services
- Minimum of three years of experience in the relevant subject area as demonstrated by employment records (i.e. a resume, website, LinkedIn profile, etc.); or
- Valid or expired Florida educator's certificate


