If your household income is above 400% of the federal poverty level, you do **not** have to submit income documentation to Step Up For Students for your student to be eligible to receive a scholarship. You must, however, enter your true and accurate total gross income within your student's scholarship application as well as submit this form.

All other students are non-priority.
