# **Home Education Instructional Program**

## **External Guide**



#### **Definition**

Home Education Instructional Programs offer courses, classes, or activities to home education and PEP scholarship students. These services must be part of the student's sequential program of instruction.

Eligible programs: FES -UA and PEP

## An eligible program must:

- Be a program selected by the parent as a part of his or her home education or PEP scholarship student's parent directed instruction;
  - Private schools, virtual schools, and public or charter schools are not considered home education instructional programs.
- Provide courses and/or activities for home education students that enhance or enrich the student's learning opportunities;
- Have publicly available/reviewable program descriptions of courses and/or activities;
- Have a published tuition and fee schedule;
- Be operated in a physical location (cannot be online), and;
- Be a business organization (tuition and fees cannot be paid to an individual, except for regional program directors or designated liaisons of national home educational communities).

Online classes or programs are not eligible as home education instructional programs. They may meet the requirements for approved online instruction or part-time tutoring.

Eligible private schools that offer courses or services to homeschoolers and PEP students cannot be approved as home education instructional programs. They may provide these services as part-time private school instruction.

### **Required Service Catalog documentation**

To make their <u>services available for direct billing in EMA</u>, home education instructional programs must provide their:

- Tuition & fee schedule
- · Address where the individual classes are held
- Completed <u>Home Education Participation Agreement form</u>
- Descriptions of courses or activities
