Definition

Horse Therapy is a service provided at a center that is a member of the Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship (PATH) International.

An approved provider is:

- PATH International's certified center in Florida is found here: <https://pathintl.org/find-a-program/>.

Required Service Catalog documentation

- Documentation confirming center membership or accreditation with PATH International.
Note: Membership or accreditation can only be accepted at the business/center level. Individual membership or accreditation cannot be accepted.

Eligible program: FES-UA

Vendor receipt/invoice **must** include:

- Scholarship student's first and last name (as it appears on the scholarship).
- Date of purchase/dates of service
- Vendor/provider name
- Description of item/service
- Receipt breakdown: item price, subtotal, taxes, fees, discounts, and grand total
- Proof of payment documentation

Note: Receipt/invoice should be on your business letterhead

Approved services include:

- Horse Therapy, or Equine Therapy, encompasses a range of treatments that involve activities with horses and other equines to promote human physical and mental health.

Riding Lessons Are Not Approved for This Category

Horseback riding lessons would not be considered horse therapy. These lessons fall under the category below:

- Instructional Materials
 - Physical Education Instruction/Membership/Fees
 - Sports Lessons.

Note: The Instructional Materials category is not currently eligible for direct pay to providers currently due to how EMA is currently set up.
