

# Scholarship Updates

#### Scholarships for Florida Schoolchildren



Dear Parent/Guardian,

Our records indicate your child was awarded a Step Up Scholarship for the 2023-2024 school year – but also that your child is <u>not</u> using the scholarship.

We are conducting this survey to better understand why some parents/guardians chose not to use the scholarship.

The survey should take less than 5 minutes. All answers will remain confidential, and none of your personal information will be shared when we publish the results.

Participation in this survey is strictly optional. There will be no negative consequences of any kind if you decline to complete the survey.

#### Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program & Family Empowerment Scholarship for Educational Options



Dear Parent/Guardian,

We are writing to let you know that a quarterly distribution will soon be made to the scholarship account of the student(s) named below.

For the 2023-24 school year, scholarship funds for students will first be deposited into the student's individual scholarship accounts. After a student's account has been funded, the school must initiate the invoicing process in EMA to generate payments from the student's account to their enrolled school.

PLEASE NOTE: These funds <u>have not</u> yet arrived in accounts and will be available in student accounts within the coming weeks. Families will receive an email notifying them once funds have been deposited.

DO NOT BE ALARMED if your student's available balance displays as \$0.00 after your funds arrive. This is because your quarterly funds are reserved for your student's tuition and fees per your acceptance of your student's private school enrollment in EMA.

Family Empowerment Scholarship for Educational Options (FES-EO), Florida Tax Credit Scholarship (FTC), and Family Empowerment Scholarship for Unique Abilities (FES-UA):

- Allow active-duty military members who have permanent change of station orders to Florida to apply for scholarships before they have a Florida address.
- Prohibit families from applying for multiple scholarships for the same student at the same time.
- Require, for RENEWAL FES-EO and FES-UA students, the Florida Department of Education (FLDOE) to release funds to scholarship-funding organizations (SFOs) no later than Aug. 1, Nov. 1, Feb. 1, and April 1.
- Require, for NEW FES-EO and FES-UA students, the FLDOE to release funds to SFOs no later than Sept. 1, Nov. 1, Feb. 1, and April 1.
- Require SFOs to release payments for full-time tuition and fees within 7 business days after approval by the parent and the private school
- Require SFOs to publish a purchasing handbook by Aug. 1, 2024, and by July 1 in all following years. The handbook must include a list of prohibited items and services, and items or services that require pre-authorization or additional documentation. The handbook must be published on the SFOs' websites and provided to the Commissioner of Education.

#### Family Empowerment Scholarship for Students with Unique Abilities (FES-UA):

- Increasing the program cap for the 2024-25 school year to 72,615 students. Categorical exemptions, for students to be considered outside of the program cap, remain.
- Beginning in the 2025-26 school year, the cap on available scholarships will annually increase by 5% (up from 3%) of the state's exceptional student education enrollment, minus gifted students. The cap will increase by an <u>additional</u> 1% following any year in which 95% of available scholarships are funded.
- Allow parents to use scholarship funds to pay tuition and fees for a prekindergarten program offered by an eligible private school.
- Allow a student to be 3 or 4 years old during the year in which the student applies, not before they apply
- Engage UCF's Center for Students with Unique Abilities to create purchasing guidelines for the FES-UA program with assistance from Florida's SFOs and input from parents of participating students.

Personalized Education Program (PEP), Transportation, Hope, and New Worlds Scholarships:

#### Personalized Education Program (PEP)

• Allow PEP students to use scholarship funds to pay for full-time tuition at private schools that address regular and direct contact with teachers through the student learning plans.

#### **Transportation Scholarship**

- Repeal the current Transportation Scholarship for public school students.
- Create a new Transportation Stipend, which will award \$750 per eligible household for K-8 students to supplement transportation costs to a Florida, non-virtual public school that is different than their assigned school.
- Prioritize students who received a Transportation Scholarship in the 23-24 school year to receive transportation stipends for the 24-25 school year.

#### **Hope Scholarship**

- Merge the Hope Scholarship Program with the FES-EO and FTC scholarship programs.
- Direct the eligible financial contributions to the FTC scholarship program.
- Allow students with bullying incidents documented by their public schools to qualify for FES-EO or FTC scholarships.

#### **New Worlds Scholarship Accounts**

- Expand eligibility for the New Worlds Scholarship Program to Voluntary Prekindergarten students with substantial deficiencies in early literacy and/or math skills, based on their most recent progress monitoring results.
- Increase scholarships from \$500 to \$1200 per student.
- Parents/guardians will use Step Up For Students direct-pay platforms to use their ESA funds beginning in the '24-25 school year.

#### **General Awareness**


- Religious virtual providers can now apply with the state to become an approved virtual instruction program provider
- Private schools can use certain facilities without specific zoning or land use requirements, provided they meet health, safety, and welfare laws.
  - A private school may use facilities on property owned or leased by a library, community service organization, museum, performing arts venue, theatre, cinema, or church facility under s. 170.201, which is or was actively used as such within 5 years of any executed agreement with a private school to use the facilities; any facility or land owned by a Florida College System institution or university; any similar public institutional facilities; and any facility recently used to house a school or child care facility licensed under s. 402.305, under any such facility's preexisting zoning and land use designations without rezoning or obtaining a special exception or a land use change, and without complying with any mitigation requirements or conditions. The facility must be located on property used solely for purposes described in this paragraph, and must meet applicable state and local health, safety, and welfare laws, codes, and rules, including firesafety and building safety.
  - A private school may use facilities on property purchased from a library, community service organization, museum, performing arts venue, theatre, cinema, or church facility under s. 170.201, which is actively or was actively used as such within 5 years of any executed agreement with a private school to purchase the facilities; any facility or land owned by a Florida College System institution or university; any similar public institutional facilities; and any facility recently used to house a school or child care facility licensed under s. 402.305, under any such facility's preexisting zoning and land use designations without obtaining a special exception, rezoning, or a land use change, and without complying with any mitigation requirements or conditions. The facility must be located on property used solely for purposes described in this paragraph, and must meet applicable state and local health, safety, and welfare laws, codes, and rules, including firesafety, and building safety.

The FTC/FES-EO parent handbook serves as a guide on how to utilize your scholarship funds.

Over the next few slides, we will show you where to find answers to some of the most frequently asked questions we get about the FTC/FES-EO scholarship.



At what age can we apply for a student to receive the FTC/EO scholarship?

# Age Requirements

- A student entering kindergarten must be 5 years old on or before September 1 of the applying school year.
- A student entering first grade must be 6 years old on or before September 1 of the applying school year.





# Can I receive multiple scholarships simultaneously?

# Multiple Scholarships

A student may utilize only one scholarship.

Families who are awarded more than one scholarship must indicate to Step Up the scholarship that they intend to utilize for the school year and decline the scholarship that they will not utilize. To decline the FTC/FES-EO scholarship, please complete this survey.

Failing to decline a scholarship may result in delayed funding.





# What information is required from families during the renewal process?

# Information Required for Renewal

Once a student qualifies for a scholarship, as long as the student is a resident of the state of Florida and eligible to enroll in a Florida public school, the student remains eligible for the scholarship until he or she returns to public school, graduates from High School or turns 21, whichever occurs first, regardless of income.



# Information Required for Renewal

#### Documents required for all renewal applications

- Proof of Florida Residency (and spouse/partner, if applicable)
- Social Security Number
  - For yourself
  - For your student
- Birth certificate for a student entering K and 1<sup>st</sup> grade

# Switching a New Scholarship

#### Who Is Eligible?

Students from age 3 through grade 12 or age 22, whichever comes first, who have a specific diagnosis.

- Anaphylaxis
- Autism spectrum disorder
- Being a high-risk child
- Cerebral Palsy
- Down syndrome
- Emotional or a behavioral disability
- Hearing impairment, including deafness
- Hospital or homebound

- Identification as dual sensory impaired
- Intellectual disability
- Language impairment
- Muscular dystrophy
- Orthopedic impairment
- Other health impairment
- Phelan-McDermid syndrome
- Prader-Willi syndrome

- Rare diseases
- Specific learning disability
- Speech impairment
- Spina bifida
- Traumatic brain injury
- Visual impairment, including blindness
- Williams syndrome






Once you are signed into EMA, click Reimbursements on the left panel of the Dashboard





#### Step II:

#### Steps for Locating Instructor's Credentials





#### **Step III by Name:**

Enter the instructor's last name and first name; the district field is optional. Then press "search."

#### **Step III by License Number:**

Enter the instructor's license number. The other fields are optional. Then press "search."


