Funding Has Arrived!

FES-UA families received funding in student ESAs.

- The received amount constitutes 25% of the yearly award.
- Step Up will receive funding from the Department of Education for the upcoming quarters on the following dates: November 1st, February 1st and April 1st
- Funds will be deposited into the student's accounts within two weeks of Step Up For Students' receipt of funds from the state.
- Renewal families will still access MyScholarShop and complete reimbursements in the Legacy system. Newly funded families (funded for the first time ever) will utilize EMA for MyScholarShop and reimbursements.

- ✓ Clarifies some of the categories in the former "pre-approved" list
- ✓ Gives more insight into how parents can and cannot use their child's scholarship.

Electives

Lessons, equipment, or consumables generally associated with elective or enrichment (non-core academic subjects), may be purchased, including:

- Music Lessons
- Art Lessons
- Cooking Supplies
- Animal Husbandry Lesson or Training Programs
- Mechanical Lessons or Training Programs
- Garden or Horticultural Lessons or Training Programs
- Enrichment Classes/Courses
- And many more...

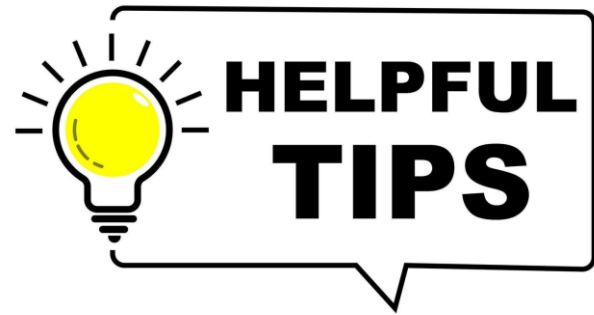
Electives Eligible Provider Requirement

Eligible providers for enrichment or elective subjects should have at least one of the following:

- A current Florida educator's certificate.
- At least 3 years of experience in the relevant subject area as demonstrated by employment records.
- Currently enrolled in a postsecondary educational institution as a student of the relevant subject area.
- A degree from a postsecondary educational institution in the relevant subject area.
- A certification or national accreditation in the relevant subject area.

Important Notes



- Many items and providers are already "Pre-Approved" and located in the 23-24 FES-UA purchasing guide.
- A Pre-Authorization process is provided to assist with reimbursements. The Pre-Authorization process may be used to determine the eligibility of a purchase prior to spending funds. In some categories, Pre-Authorization is required.
- Some Instructional Materials have restrictions (such as age restrictions), so familiarize yourself with these before submitting for reimbursement.
- There are also specific requirements for tutors and other providers to ensure a high-quality educational experience.
- MyScholarShop (MSS) is available for purchases and comes directly from your ESA account.



Purchasing Guide Cont...

Instructional Materials

At Home Classroom Furnishing Update

- **ADDED** desks, chairs, storage, picnic tables, indoor projectors, projector screens.
- Moved televisions under this category
- Frequency of Purchase: These items are still only allowed every 2 years.
- **Please note:** Multiples of any item under “At Home Classroom Furnishing” are not permitted



Books

- Books are neither capped in annual spending nor subject to frequency of purchase. Two copies of a book are permitted in the event that the second copy is used as a parent or companion reader. However, requests for more than two copies of the same book will be denied.
- Books with content that may pose a threat to the student or others or promote violence or criminal behavior are ineligible for purchase.



Digital Devices



Frequency of Purchase:
2 years per device type

- This category was previously known as “Device-Digital.”
- **ADDED** web-centric laptops (such as Chromebooks and Surfaces).
- **ADDED** Game consoles must now be purchased with an educational game.
- **REMOVED** smartphones and smartwatches
- **UPDATED** Game consoles purchased with educational software
- What else is covered: desktop computer, laptop computer, tablet, e-Reader

Training and Maintenance for Digital Devices

- Scholarship funds may be used to train parents/guardians or students on how to use digital devices, digital peripheral devices, or assistive technology devices.
- Maintenance agreements for eligible devices purchased with FES-UA funds are eligible. Maintenance agreements are defined as service agreements with a device manufacturer or vendor to support regular service on that device.
- **Please note:** Maintenance agreements **do not** include warranties, extended warranties, or service contracts.

Specialized Services



Pre-Approved Specialized Services

These are the **ONLY** pre-approved specialized services for the 23-24 fiscal year:

- Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) services
- Occupational Therapist services
- Physical Therapist services
- Listening and Spoken Language Specialist services
- Psychotherapy or counseling by a Florida licensed Psychologist, Mental Health Counselor, or Clinical Social Worker
- Music Therapy
- Art Therapy
- Horse therapy
(must be a PATH certified center)

PLEASE NOTE:

If a specialized service is not listed here, you should complete a pre-authorization request to see if the service can be authorized to be paid or reimbursed with FES-UA funds for your child.



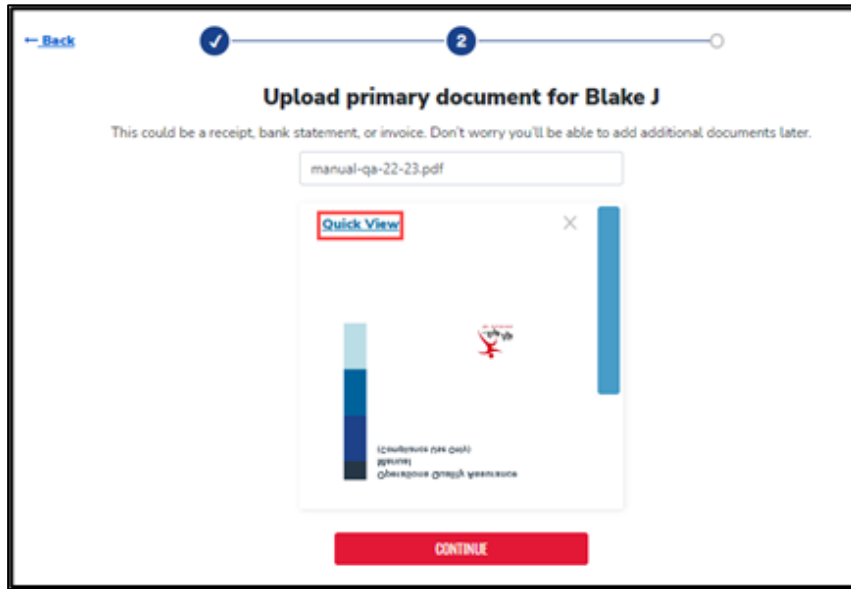


Select **Quick View** to review the document or receipt, as necessary, and then select **CONTINUE**.

To add another item to the reimbursement request select **ADD ITEM**. When all items are added and fields are complete, select **DONE**.



Registration Questions and Answers

- **Are siblings of an FES-UA student automatically eligible as well? What scholarship options are available for siblings of students with FES-UA Scholarship?**

- No, siblings will not automatically qualify because the other child is a recipient of the FES-UA Scholarship. With the passing of HB1, all students that are eligible for K-12 Florida public school, regardless of income, are eligible to receive the FTC (Florida Tax Credit) Scholarship or the FES-EO (Florida Empowerment Scholarship for Educational Options) Scholarship.

- **Will the scholarship be considered as income for tax purposes?**

- No, the Florida scholarships are not considered income.

- **If my child remains in public school, can I still use my FES-UA scholarship to pay for his speech therapy, occupational therapy, or tutoring?**

- A child that is enrolled full-time in a public or charter school cannot use the FES-UA scholarship.

Registration Questions and Answers

- **My daughter has been awarded FTC/FES-EO and FES-UA. When all of the funds in the FES-UA scholarship have been used up, can I then start using the FTC/FES-EO or vice versa?**
 - Families may apply for multiple scholarships **BUT** can only use the funds from one scholarship in a school year.
- **How do I decline the FES-EO scholarship if my child was awarded an FES-UA scholarship?**
 - To decline a scholarship, the parent/guardian should scan the QR code or go to this link to notify SUFS that they would like to decline a scholarship: <https://tinyurl.com/d7433ubr>
- **How long will my child be waitlisted? Can I apply for reimbursement for expenses while they are waitlisted?**
 - There is no definitive amount of time which a child may be waitlisted. You may not apply for reimbursements while the child is waitlisted. If they are removed from the waitlist and funded, you may then request reimbursement for any pre-approved item or expense made on or after July 1, 2023.



Registration Questions and Answers

- **If money is left over from my FES-UA child's scholarship, can I use these funds for a sibling's tuition?**
 - No, you may not apply funds from one child's scholarship to a sibling's tuition. You may use it for other expenses for the student that has the FES-UA scholarship such as therapies, digital devices, extracurricular lessons and many other options.
- **We received a voucher for VPK Preschool, is there a way to discontinue that and use the FES-UA Scholarship?**
 - If your preschooler has been awarded an FES-UA scholarship, do not provide a VPK voucher to your child's school. If you have already done so, please advise the school that you would like to have that voucher withdrawn. You may also contact your Early Learning Coalition for more assistance.
- **Does my FES-UA student have to attend a participating private school to be funded?**
 - No, an FES-UA student may also homeschool and still be funded; however, tuition and fees can only be reimbursed at an eligible participating private school.
